Welcome from the Chair of the Parish Council

Welcome to our third newsletter, which we hope you will find useful and interesting.

We have had a busy few months over the winter, with councillors and staff working hard on various projects to enhance our village and benefit our community.



I want to make sure everyone realises that next year, in May 2025, it will be local election time. In the more than twenty years since I first moved to Millbrook, there has never been a contested election for the Parish Council, because there have never been more candidates than available seats – often, there are not enough people standing to even fill the full complement of thirteen seats.

This might be interpreted as a huge vote of confidence in what the Council has been doing, but to be honest seems more like a belief the Council can just keep on going without any fresh input or new councillors. It can't. A number of the current councillors are retired; several have been councillors for many years. We need new people, and ideally we need a contested election in 2025 so that you, our parishioners, actually have the chance to vote on who should represent you and manage the public assets of the village for you.

We now have vacancies for two councillors to bring us up to full strength this year, so if you are interested in putting your name forward for co-option, please contact the Clerk. And please look out for more information in the next newsletter about how to stand for election in 2025 and what being a councillor entails. Your Council needs you!

Parish Councillor Introductions



Cllr Don Wood

I moved from Hertfordshire to the Rame Peninsula in 1994, and ran an hotel and restaurant business for 5 years or so. Having sold the business, I moved into New Street, Millbrook, in 2001. For the first time in my life I was to be living alone, and was somewhat apprehensive about being lonely. I need not have worried; Millbrook made me very welcome and the few people I knew in the village immediately included me into their circle, resulting in an expanding number of new friends.

In 2003 Millbrook Parish Council was suffering from a dearth of members and had several unresolved ongoing problems. There was a new intake of members in the Spring of 2003; I and the current vice chair joined at the same time, making us the longest serving continuous members. My motivation was to give something back to a community that strongly reminded me of growing up in the 1950's in a village in rural Hertfordshire.

My successor from 2019, Nicky Roberts, has concentrated on firming up our procedures & practices, to the point of possibly entering Millbrook in the National Parish Council annual competition. Notwithstanding her administrative knowledge and skills she has also been very active in a variety of initiatives, the renewal of the skate park, traffic concerns, and I well remember her reading the proclamation of our King's appointment to our residents, followed by our wonderful Street (car park) party in our majesties' honour.

For my part, having walked the Camino through France and Spain and been struck by how even small villages, hamlets and communes took pride in their community, on my appointment I was suitably inspired. I made it my focus as chairman to improve the look of our Parish and hopefully, engender some pride in the village. This included forming a volunteer group, initially to clear gutters and storm drains of rubbish, not only improving the look but also reducing the flood risk. This volunteer group morphed into the Village Enhancement Team (VETS) who look after the flower displays weeding & planting etc – this group is still in operation under the guiding hand of Cllr. Lewis, giving the village an attractive, cared for, look.

It is my opinion that each chair and the appointment of new councillors builds on previous good work to the improving benefit of our community.

As a Parish Council member I also serve on the Finance Committee, Staffing Committee, Planning Committee and other behind the scenes initiatives. This keeps me involved in village life and active; now in my 70s, long may it continue.

Thank you Millbrook, despite some bumps along the way, it has been a privilege and a pleasure to serve our village, best move of my life.

It has been an exceptionally busy few months, with lots happening around the Peninsula. I am delighted to see the Skatepark open and being so well used, it has been a joy to support the crew that have made this happen and I am really looking forward to the opening event on the 4th May - I hope we will see you all there.

Warming up for the BIG event of the annual Black Prince Flower Boat festival on Monday 6th May - if you live on the route, please do decorate your house, it adds so much to the day!



I am delighted to be able to share that the flooding at Nanny Parsons is finally to be sorted out, we at last have the funding AND the agreement in place to deal with the collapsed culvert now we just need a good spell of dry weather, and the work will start. Huge thanks to the Edgcumbes for helping get this sorted.

My casework load, at the moment, continues to be dominated with residents who are being evicted from properties through no fault evictions, and with a serious lack of affordable homes available for them to move to. I am looking forward to seeing the planning application being submitted for 20 new affordable rent homes up by Parsons Court; these will have Section 106 agreements on them, which means that they will be offered to those on the housing register with a local link to Millbrook Parish first and foremost.

Voter ID - Get Ready to Vote!

Voters in England need to show photo ID to vote at polling stations in some elections.

This applies to:

- UK Parliamentary Elections; including General Elections.
- By-elections and Recall Petitions
- Local Elections and By-elections
- Police and Crime Commissioner Elections.

Some examples of valid IDs:

- UK Passport or Driving licence (this includes a provisional driving licence),
- A Blue Badge,
- Older person or disabled UK bus pass,
- Registered Blind SmartPass,
- Identity card (bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram - a PASS card)



You will only need to show one form of photo ID which must be the original version and not a photocopy. Don't have ID? Apply for free voter ID now.

If you don't have accepted photo ID, you can apply for a free voter ID document, which is known as a Voter Authority Certificate. This can be done online or by post as follows:

The election of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Devon and Cornwall will be on Thursday 2nd May 2024 and polling cards have been sent out to all registered voters.


Tracey Lee, Chief Executive of Plymouth City Council, will be the Police Area Returning Officer (PARO) responsible for co-ordinating and running the election.

Village Enhancement Team (VETs)

The VETs look after the Tanyard, the planters on the Quay and five boats.

We have not been out much since the last newsletter other than to tidy up the Tanyard for the Christmas Lights switch on. We hope the rain will eventually stop, and we can get going again.

Some of us were pleased to be able to help with the yellow rattle sowing in the lakeside verges in February, even if we did get quite muddy in the process of treading it all in!

A list of dates the VETs plan to meet will be published shortly.



The plan for the next few months is to continue tidying the Tanyard, planters and boats in addition to giving the boats a much need spruce up and coat of paint, as they are getting quite shabby and weatherbeaten.

The plants in the boats need to be tidied and pruned and any self-sown weeds or grass removed. In addition we need to replace plants that didn't survive either the hot dry summer or the amount of rain we have been subjected to in the last few months. The new plants will need to be tough to cope with the Cornish weather!

Local businesses can adopt a boat or planter and have a small plaque erected and we have received several donations of plants and money to help keep up our planting programme.

As the climate is changing, we are revising what we plant to avoid hours spent watering. The aim is to encourage bees and insects as well as making the village attractive.

We have a boat and a planter full of herbs from which people are welcome to take cuttings to use in their cookery.







We meet monthly for a couple of hours on a Saturday afternoon, weather permitting. Please contact us via the office if you are interested in joining this friendly group.

Village Maintenance - Yellow Rattle

Last year's consultations with parishioners and Cormac led to the suggestion from our grass-cutting contractor that sowing yellow rattle seeds in the verges adjacent to New Road might help reduce the number of complaints about the verges.

As Cormac has been trialling this approach elsewhere in Cornwall, their staff were happy to agree some areas alongside the lake could be included in the trial. This means that although the sections of verge immediately alongside the road will continue to be cut by Cormac as usual this year, the inner parts of the verge towards the Tractor Park and the area opposite the park entrance will be managed differently.

The designated areas were scarified by Cormac in February using specialist machinery, and then councillors and volunteers braved the erratic weather to sow and tread in the seed mix provided by Cormac. This involved raking over the top surface to make sure the rain hadn't compacted the soil too much, scattering the seed mix, and then doing what can only be described as a penguin waddle over the sown areas to tread the seeds into the soil. Dignified it was not!

The seed mix was part yellow rattle and part wildflower mix, so we are hoping for some splashes of colour when the seeds germinate and grow to full size.

The reason yellow rattle is so important to the mix is that it acts as a parasite plant to the grass, weakening the grass growth and keeping it from getting as long, while also providing a little colour itself.

Future cutting of the seeded areas will be carefully managed to allow any successful wildflowers to set seed, and any grass clippings will be removed to reduce the soil's fertility, because wildflowers actually thrive in fairly poor soil.

The Council would like to thank everyone who came out to help with the seed sowing, especially the children from Millbrook School and Millbrook Preschool, the VETs and Hill from Enhanscapes, who had to show us all how it was done!

RCT also cares for the heritage assets at Maker Heights, including 12 hectares of rare unimproved grassland, 4 Scheduled Ancient Monuments and the impressive Grade II* Listed Barrack Block.

The heritage assets at Maker Heights are unique, original and, at the present time, largely unaltered. Consequently, Maker Heights is of national importance, and of outstanding significance. These assets are all vital components of the Historic Landscape and are set in the Cornwall Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (Rame Head AONB)

Final preparations and finishing touches are complete for Maker's 2024 season campsite, which re-opened on 19th April. Maker Camp is a charity-run enterprise. All profits are re-invested by the Rame Conservation Trust into the heritage and natural beauty of the site, protecting it for future generations

Pigshill & Clarrick Woods

We are a community interest company who manage our beautiful 66-acre woodland for ecology, community and sustainability.

We have had a busy few months, including hosting volunteer groups ranging from large companies like Babcock to small groups like TST, who work with young people with complex issues.

We also have a wonderful team of committed regular volunteers. Volunteer tasks have enabled us to continue to enhance the resilience and ecological integrity of the woods and to improve the woodland biodiversity. For example, removing diseased trees and invasive species, maintaining access and open spaces and managing a range of native tree species of differing ages.





Over this winter we were pleased to start a sustainable coppice rotation, using hand tools to cut our first coup. This increases the diversity of habitats within the woods.

Coppice products are available from Widdicombe's in West Street and other local outlets:

- Beanpoles: £8.50 for 6, or £1.50 each
- Fenceposts: £2 each
- Charcoal (when available): £10 per bag.



We also have a new tree nursery where we aim to grow native tree saplings for use in the woods and locally.

Throughout the very wet winter we continued to provide sustainable local firewood, with a Cornwall Community Foundation fund enabling us to supply subsidised firewood to lower income households.

Currently our volunteering days are on Mondays and Tuesdays with occasional Saturdays. All are welcome.

Rame Peninsula Beach Care is a charity set up by like minded people to tackle the problem of plastic pollution on the beaches around the Rame Peninsula.



We are focused on conservation and preservation around the Rame Peninsula as well as promoting education to enhance conservation and improve our marine and shoreline environment. We also link with other organisations such as Cornwall Wildlife Trust and the Marine Conservation Society to enhance the effects of our work on marine conservation. We are a charity and rely on donations to keep operating so many thanks for any support.

Through regular beach cleans in 2023 we gathered 1,669kg of plastic waste from our beaches!

The source of the plastic is varied and some has travelled far on ocean currents, some from more local sources. Many people enjoy finding some of the 'treasures' uncovered, such as pieces of Lego from the spill in 1997.

Our beach cleans are carried out by many members of our fantastic community, families, young and old, groups such as Cubs, Duke of Edinburgh Award participants, student volunteers and also companies such as Babcock. Thank you all for your hard work improving our beaches.

Millbrook Lake Moorings Association (MLMA)

Millbrook Lake Moorings Association is a company limited by guarantee set up by the local users of the lake to ensure that the control of lake moorings remains within the community.

The MLMA manages swinging and beach moorings on the tidal lake (on behalf of Millbrook Parish Council) and provides dinghy parks for tenders at the dam and Dexter's Spit.

The MLMA tries to ensure that the lake remains an asset to the community and carries out periodic inspections to ensure that moorings are being used in accordance with our lease with the Duchy of Cornwall - which owns most of the seabed.

Last year we refurbished the dinghy park at the dam to remove weeds and provide easier access to the water. Some dinghies of unknown origin were transferred to the Dexter's Spit dinghy park. We also scrapped a wrecked boat as it was in danger of breaking up.

This year, as part of our effort to ensure that we can contact boat owners if their vessel requires attention in an emergency, we will be providing licence stickers that should be displayed prominently on all vessels in order to identify them and confirm that they are entitled to moor on the lake.

MILLBROOK VILLAGE HALL REDUCES ITS CARBON FOOTPRINT!



WE ARE SAVING 3.27 METRIC TONNES OF CO2 EMMISSIONS EACH YEAR (= 8,000+ miles driven by an average petrol car)

We have achieved this in 2021 by replacing the failing oil boiler, which consumed an average of nearly 2,000 litres of oil a year, with an Air Source Heat Pump (ASHP) which is situated on the balcony (the only location available)

The total cost of installation, removal of boiler, failing oil tank and redecoration was £15,750

(£10,000 grant from the National Lottery + Parish Council £1600 grant for the electrics, remainder from Millbrook Village Hall funds)

We are very pleased with the ASHP. It works very well with the hall's underfloor heating, the excellent insulation within the building and double glazing to most windows and doors.

It's less odorous and overall a much cleaner set up than having oil but obviously now we have larger electricity bills. However we have 14 solar panels (*installed* 2010) and get 4 payments a year from the government scheme which helps.

In fact, we are having complaints that in some areas it's too warm despite the thermostats being turned right down.

Some rooms do need it be higher due to their location within the building.

Adjusting underfloor heating is a slow process and takes about 12-24hrs so, it's difficult to get a happy medium as you can imagine.

But at least the hall is warm even if a bit too cosy at times!

Rame Community First Responders

Rame Community First Responders is a group of trained, unpaid volunteers with the ambulance service.

We attended around 220 calls in 2023. CFRs are deployed to patients when either there are no ambulances immediately available or the CFRs are able to attend promptly for immediate lifesaving care, such as cardiac arrest, chest pain, breathing difficulties, patients who are unconscious, fitting, or showing stroke symptoms.



We carry oxygen, a defibrillator, blood pressure/temperature/oxygen level monitors etc so we can relay crucial information to the ambulance service.

We also attend patients who have fallen but are uninjured, and we can use a lifting chair. Attending these incidents often frees an ambulance.

Rame group now has six CFRs allowing us to continue to try to provide 24 hour cover, 365 days per year. We are in a minority of CFRs nationally who have fundraised to buy and run our own dedicated liveried vehicle – you may see us around. Our fundraising is ongoing and we would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has donated.

We are proud that our work helps our community, and always interested to hear from potential recruits! We have a Facebook page which will also carry information relating to recruitment.

An Automated External Defibrillator (AED) or defibrillator is a life saving device that can help save the life of someone experiencing a sudden cardiac arrest.

They are easy to use, portable, with clear step-by-step instructions so anyone can use them.

PPG is a group of volunteers, all of whom are patients of the Rame Group Practice.

We aim to advise Rame Group Practice on the issues which matter most to patients, and to work in partnership with them to help identify solutions to any challenges. We always respect practice and patient confidentiality.



We meet four times a year, usually at the practice, and encourage any patient to become a member, endeavouring for the broadest representation of patients' views as possible. We work with the practice to achieve a better understanding of patients' health needs and to make every contact with the practice as rewarding as it can be for staff and patients alike.

We can assist the practice by informing patients in the community about preventative medicine, healthy lifestyle choices, appropriate use of healthcare services and any other areas to improve the health of both patients and staff of the Rame Group Practice. We get involved with and support healthy projects, for example we initiated the Wellbeing Garden at Penntorr, securing funding for its creation and ongoing development from Torpoint Town Council. Some of us also volunteer to help guide patients through the flu and Covid clinics.

Through sharing of views in a non-judgmental way, we can work collaboratively with the practice and support its aims for the health of the community.

We will be able to work more closely with local groups including Torpoint Town Council, Friends of Thanckes Park, Torpoint Library & Community Hub, CHAT, Deviock Activity Group, The Peninsula Trust and others to allow more people to use our services. We also hope to help people access local employment opportunities through strategic partnerships.

Looking ahead, we are excited about the potential for new projects with sponsors Case UK and deeper community engagement.

YOUTH MUSIC LAB AT PATCHWORK STUDIOS



Patchwork Studios is a creative community centre housing a recording studio, a performance venue, and an art space, gallery and cocktail bar. An ambitious social enterprise run by volunteer directors, all profits are reinvested into projects that help people.

Our safe spaces atop the hill encourage creativity and provide freedom for self expression and exploration, helping to develop talents, skills and confidence. We curate an annual programme of creative workshops, exhibitions and events to inspire and empower. Our flagship youth project is Youth Music Lab, which this winter has been generously supported by Millbrook Parish Council.

With six mentors and up to two dozen local youths in regular attendance, these weekly gatherings for band development and songcraft are helping to pave the way for many young people to improve their musicianship, their confidence to perform, and their ability to work together, whilst providing a solid platform to grow creatively and socially as they mature into adulthood.

We consider antisocial behaviour a critical symptom of a larger social issue, brought on by a lack of youth services and opportunities, reduced creative education in state curriculums, and a lack of outlets for boredom and frustration. It's important to us that this project will always be free for youths to attend, in order to provide equal opportunity to everyone, despite income or background.

In the eight years our doors have been open, a growing number of people have relied on us to help improve their mental health and wellbeing. Our affordable schedule works to bridge the culture gap between old and young, creating a better understanding of beliefs and values, and improving respect across our community. Want to know more? On the Buses

Update from the Rame Peninsula Public Transport Users Group

Several folk have told me that due to the endless cancellations of local bus services they have waited for ages at a bus stop and then had to get a taxi to get to work or to attend a hospital or other medical or important appointment.

If you do have to get a taxi because the bus doesn't turn up ask for a receipt from the driver and send it to Plymouth City Bus and I've been told they may refund your taxi fare!!

Also, at a recent meeting of our Rame Peninsula Public Transport Users Group I asked a City Bus manager who attended why I hadn't received the usual bus timetables to distribute. His response: "You all do things online now!"

I replied that people like me in their eighties and nineties do not all do things on line and it was discrimination against the local elderly population. In a couple of days' time I had 200 timetables delivered to me by Cornwall Council!

We also raised passenger feedback about the huge size of the current bus timetables covering the whole of Cornwall and asked why we couldn't have a more regional one. A few weeks ago I had a call from Plymouth City bus to say that when the new bus timetables come out at the beginning of April there will be a localised one for the Rame Peninsula area!!

Cornwall Council Bus News - Partnership Electric Bus Venture

Cornwall's first electric buses will take to our streets next year, helping to cut carbon emissions and improve air quality.

Cornwall Council has successfully bid for funding from the Department for Transport ZEBRA 2 fund to replace the entire Truro Park & Ride fleet with electric buses and provide a new electric bus for the Falmouth Town Service.



A further six electric buses are set to be introduced in South-East Cornwall as part of a bid led by Plymouth City Council and Plymouth CityBus/Go Cornwall Bus in partnership with Cornwall Council.

These buses will run on the 70/A/B routes around Torpoint and the Rame Peninsula.



Community Consultation - Millbrook Car Park

In July 2012, following negotiations with Cornwall Council, Millbrook Parish Council signed a 99-year lease agreement for the operation and maintenance of Millbrook Car Park in West Street and the public toilets on The Parade. This asset "devolution" was led by former Cornwall Councillor George Trubody, following concerns that Cornwall Council intended to close the public toilets and dramatically increase the car parking charges.

Patchwork repairs to the car park surface have been carried out several times already, the most recent repair costing nearly £2000. Full resurfacing could cost as much as £100k. The Council needs to build up reserves for a new car park machine (costing approximately £5,000) and future surface repair/replacement.

The car park machine fees have not changed since Millbrook Parish Council took over responsibility, although permit charges have been increased. It seems unfair that daily visitor parking has not also gone up yet, but before we can alter the car park daily charges the Council is required to carry out a consultation.

Your feedback is needed on the following:

Car Park Fees

- Would you be in support of increasing the car park charges, so that the cost of maintaining the car park is absorbed by the users of the car park?
- Would you be in support of not increasing the charges but adding maintenance costs to the precept so the costs would be built into your council tax charges?

· Vehicle Size

 Do you think there should be a vehicle size restriction for parking in West Street Car park?

It is a great place to share ideas and skills and there is usually someone who can help with a crafting question or problem.


We don't have a membership fee and just ask for £2 each week to cover the costs of refreshments and the hire of the hall.

Fly-tipping is the illegal dumping of rubbish or bulky items on land not licensed to receive it.

- Not only does fly tipping make the village look untidy it is also illegal and you could receive a fine of up to £1,000.
- Although it appears to save individuals money in the short term, the knock on effect means that everyone is affected - the costs of Cornwall Council's fly tipping are recovered through your Council Tax.
- The nearest recycling centre is in Saltash approximately 17 miles away.
- Bulky waste collections can be arranged with Cornwall Council for a fee - see the CC website.
- There are also local companies who collect unwanted items.
- If you are giving away items via the local Facebook sites please only leave items out when they are due to be collected.

Information on the cost of fly tipping in this country is available on the UK Government website & states: "For these large fly-tipping incidents, the cost of clearance to local authorities in England in 2022/23 was £13.2 million".
